Side Event at UN Ocean Conference June 9, 2017 09:00 - 10:30 AM **Solutions to marine plastic litter**

Marine litter is today a demanding global challenge, which affects different societies unequally as a consequence of sea currents, potential for waste management, economic incentives to reduce plastic products etc. In areas with strong dependence on tourism and fishing (like Small Island Developing States and Least Developed Countries), marine debris has the potential to cause extensive harm to the environmental, social and economic values.
