Purpose of the job

SAR is seeking a communications intern to support the work of the communication team, constituted by a Communication Director and a communication officer. This internship is expected to last 6 months, with possibility of extension. The successful candidate would ideally start working in August.

Main responsibilities

 Searching for new photos. Creation of visuals.
- Keeping SAR's website updated. Assisting with the compilation and dissemination of the newsletter.

- Assisting with the organisation of events and internal communication.
- Monitoring press articles and compiling the press review, searching for new journalists and keeping the press contact list updated.
