9 The Future of Fisheries Subsidies: From 17:: June Imbalance to Equity, towards the creation of an Ocean Fund

Focusing on fisheries subsidies as one of the main drivers of the existing inequity in the fisheries sector between various fleet segments, this session will explore how funding can make nature restoration targets a reality and better support a just transition in the sector. It will also discuss how the WTO agreement on fisheries subsidies can facilitate the global transition to sustainable fisheries and highlight the need to secure its entry into force. The transition of the fisheries sector needs to happen to create a triple bottom line impact: good for the environment, for people today and future generations, and for the economies of coastal communities.

Call for action: Side event organisers are calling on States to take urgent action to support the transition of the fisheries sector and support Small-Scale Low Impact fishers by removing harmful subsidies and pushing for the adoption of the WTO Agreement on fisheries subsidies, together with providing the necessary financial support to enable the transition of the fisheries sector. This call also includes the need to properly fund environmental protection and restoration, as a key tool to ensure the long-term resilience of the fisheries sector.
